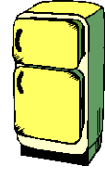


Refrigerator Words



The Kindergarten Curriculum requires students to learn the first 25 sight words plus 14 additional words from the Harcourt Reading Program. Below you will find the words and some ideas to help your child learn them. Begin with the first 5. When your child has mastered that list, go to the next 5 and continue until your child has mastered all 39 words. Remember that you have the entire school year to work on these words, but it is very important that your child learns them.

- Make a list of the first five words and hang it on the refrigerator. Every time your child opens the fridge, he/she needs to read the words. When those words are memorized, hang up the next five words.
- Make two sets of flashcards and play Sight Word Memory.
- Make the words in sand, salt, pudding or shaving cream!
- Use a magazine, have your child cut out letters to make the words. Glue them on a piece of paper.
- Use magnet letters on your refrigerator to make the words..
- Give your student a highlighter; have him/her highlight the sight words in the newspaper.
- Write the word on a 3 X 5 card. Cut it out like a puzzle. Have your child put the puzzle together.
- When you are reading with or to your child, have him/her point out the sight words they know.
- Write a sentence using a sight word. Have your child draw a picture to go with the sentence.
