Topics

Geography

To provide an understanding of the human and physical characteristics of the earth's places and regions and how people of different backgrounds interact with their environment.

The **five themes of geography** provide a framework for teaching geography; they include location, place, human-environment interaction, movement, and region.

Civics/ Government

To recognize the relationships of events and people, and to interpret patterns, themes, ideas, beliefs, and turning points in World History. To develop knowledge and skills for informed, responsible participation in public life.

■ **Economics** – enable students to make reasoned judgments about personal economic questions and broader questions of economic policy.
