



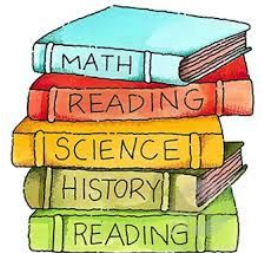

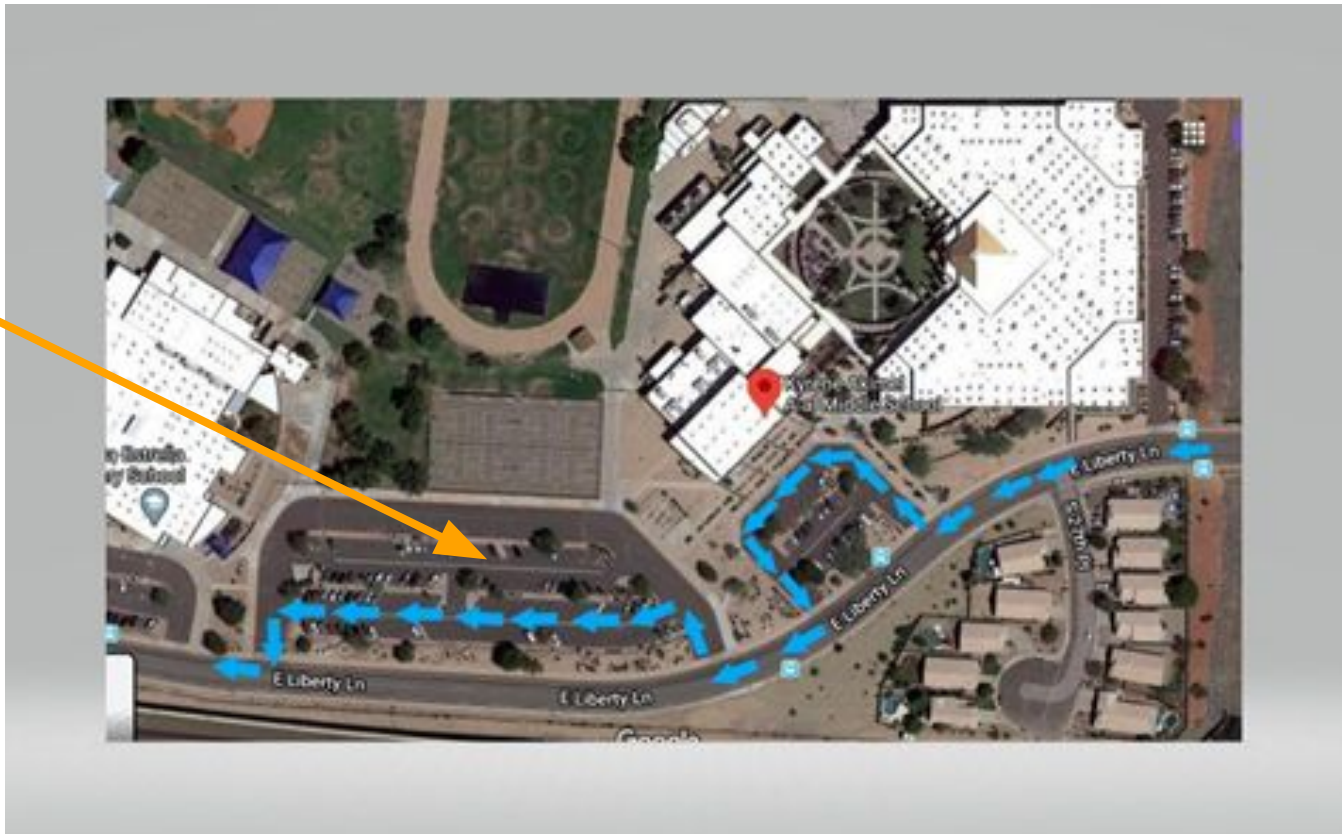

Lane

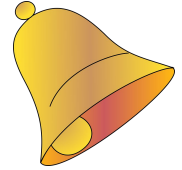
Google Classroom



- All work will be assigned through Google Classroom.
- Students will **join by teacher's class code** in the **first week** of school.
- Assignments are accessed from Google Classroom and submitted here, too.
- Parents can **view student assignments** by having their **student log in** to Google Classroom and opening the **Classwork** tab.

New, improved online learning!

Unlike in the spring, now **attendance is expected** during **scheduled class times** per the **“bell” schedule**.



Work is graded. Missing assignments and/or low scores will impact the student's overall grade.

Live instruction with Zoom class meetings daily will help students connect to their teacher and classmates and make learning more engaging!

Check grades weekly in ParentVue or StudentVue

Parents can **view** student's **attendance, tardies, grades, missing assignments**, etc. in **ParentVue**.

Students can access this info in StudentVue.

Check ParentVue at least **once a week** to stay up-to-date.

Encourage your student to turn in missing work promptly and to communicate with their teacher about their grade.

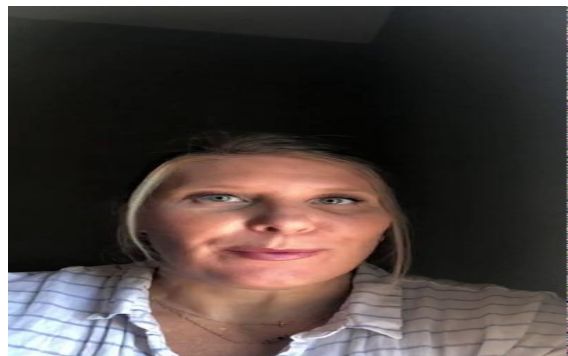

What do students do in an Intervention Class?

Intervention students get personalized online instruction from our I-ready diagnostic program. In addition to these lessons, they get small group support for grade level work in their regular ELA and math classes. Our goal is to close any learning gaps that students have to increase their skills in ELA and math.





What does intervention look like each week?

Due to our instruction being online this year, there are two ways instruction is going to be provided:

- 1. Some students will have support during their math and reading class core instruction time.**
- 2. All students will get pulled out into small groups to review grade level material 2-3 times a week for 30 mins.**
- 3. All students will be expected to complete 1 hour of online instruction using I-ready passing 1-2 lessons each week.**
- 4. All students will be expected to complete 3 assignments in Google classroom that work on specific skills that are areas of concern.**
