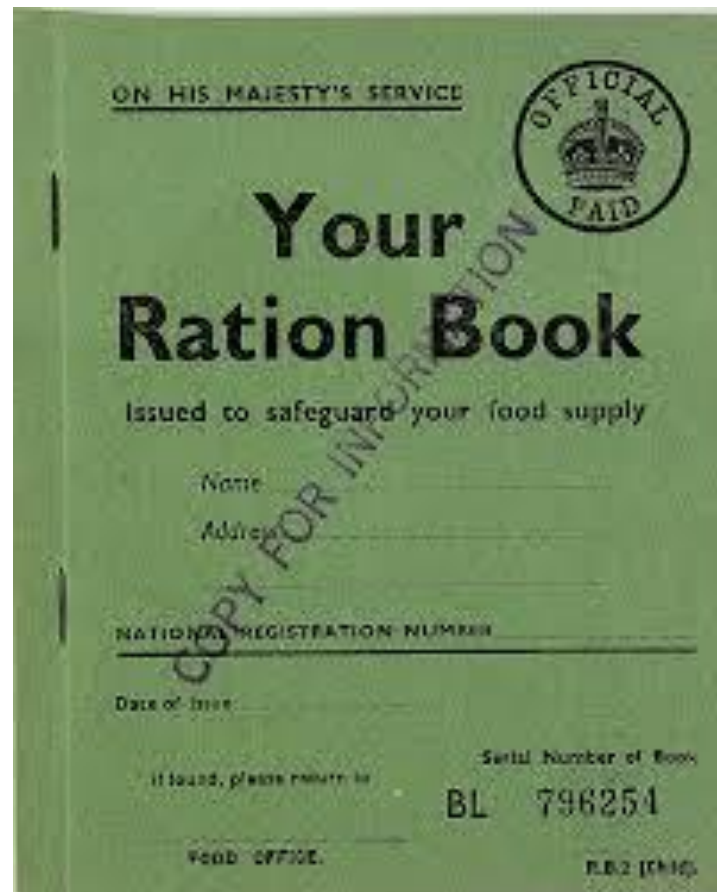


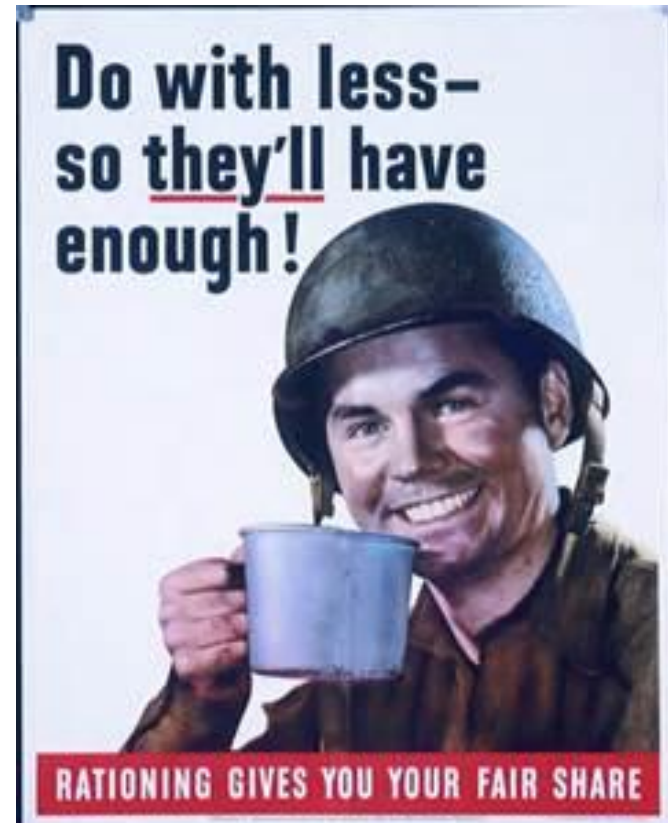
WW II Home front



Ration

To provide resources & meet needs of military

Americans started to **ration** war materials like food, rubber, oil and other man made/natural resources



War Bonds

- Americans helped pay for the war.
- Cash in after the war
- Loan to government



Victory Gardens

- Raised food for family, friends, and neighbors
- National duty
- Allowed more supplies to be shipped to troops

Posters - gain support for the war

Workplace - Women & Minorities

Low unemployment –end Great Depression

Women & minorities took place of men & became wage earners due to shortage of men

“**Rosie the Riveter**” was a fictional symbol - represented working women & encouraged them to work

Minority groups migrated from the South to the North for jobs

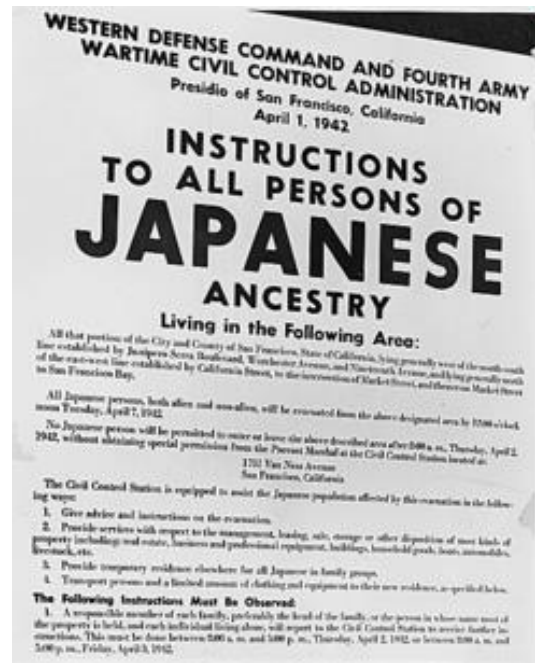


Executive Order 9066

After Pearl Harbor, anti-Japanese feeling grew

People distrusted Japanese-Americans living in the U.S.

Pres. Roosevelt signed **Executive Order 9066** -persons of Japanese ancestry to leave the Pacific coast.



Japanese Internment Camps

Over 100,000 Japanese-Americans were forced to leave their homes, possessions & businesses

Relocated to prison-like **internment camps**.

Most were native born American citizens (**Nisei**).

Many Japanese Americans volunteered for the armed forces to show their loyalty



Korematsu v. U.S.

- Fred Korematsu sued the U.S. (Supreme Court)
- He stated that **Executive Order 9066** was unconstitutional
- His claim was denied.
- Rights may be taken during wartime
