ELA:

This week in language arts, we practiced the ck sound and double consonant sounds. We introduced the exclamation point, question mark, and period. We discussed and practiced when it is appropriate to use these punctuation marks in our writing. We continued to practice naming nouns and identifying them in a sentence. This week we started reading groups while the students are at stations. This is the time where each group is leveled based on their reading ability. All groups will be meeting with a qualified teacher during this time to help them with their academic needs while challenging them within a small group. In our CKLA Listening Domain, we continued our Human Body Unit. We studied the difference of good and bad germs, vaccines, and the food pyramid. This unit will conclude next week where they have to match the body parts to the correct body system and explain what makes a person healthy by providing evidence from what they have learned.

In math, we have been reviewing and practicing combinations of numbers 6-10. We have been practicing games and memorable songs to help us remember these important facts. We continued to practice pulling out an equation or number bond from a story problem. Next week we will start a new unit that will help students with strategies such as: counting on and counting back, using compensation, counting three times, using five-and-ten structures, using doubles and near doubles, making tens, and using trail and adjustment.

In social studies, we finished our studies in Canada. We learned about moose and beavers, common food in Canada, the process of how maple syrup is made, common slang or languages spoken in Canada, and famous landmarks. Our next stop in North America will be Mexico!
